

Terms and Conditions of Publication

- These terms and conditions will be effective as of 06/05/2015.
- Authors agree to submit an abstract of their proposed article no longer than 28 days after acceptance of an invitation to publish.
- In relation to the first draft, authors agree for the following processes to be undertaken by the Editing Committee:
 - Language review (conducted by native speakers)
 - Editing of style and footnotes according to GroJIL's in-house style guide
 - Formatting of the article
- The edited version of articles will be presented to authors for approval prior to publication, and changes may be contested. However, the Editor-in-Chief retains the right of final approval of articles for publication.
- The Journal may refuse the publications of articles which do not conform to its Publishing Profile (available at <http://grojil.org/submissions/>).
- GroJIL will only publish papers that have not been previously published elsewhere.
- Once submitted for publication, the Journal may publish the articles at <http://grojil.org>. GroJIL may, at its discretion, publish the Journal through online databases, including via GroJIL's [SSRN page](#).

- If an author wishes to publish a draft version of their submitted article prior to its publication in the Journal, they must first obtain the permission of the Journal's Editorial Board.
- If an author wishes to republish the same article elsewhere, they must first obtain the permission of the Journal's Editorial Board.
- If an author is unable to meet a deadline previously agreed upon with the Editorial Board, they must notify the Board within a reasonable time (ie before the expiration of the deadline).
- In the event of late submission by an author, the Journal reserves the right to publish the remainder of the relevant issue on the planned publication date, adding the late submission at a later date, upon completion of the editing process.
